The course will include a practical approach to drafting Postponed Possession Orders including their potential use in nuisance cases along with guidance on the use of Form N28A.

Consideration will also be given to outstanding issues such as the impact of Postponed Possession Orders upon Assured Tenancies and the future of Tolerated Trespassers.
